The **ARPDC Annual report and Annual Plan** were presented at the January CASS Provincial Board meeting and approved.


ARPDC is developing an **Assurance Framework** that will be implemented in January of 2024 and guide the creation of the ARPDC Annual Plan for the 2024/2025 school year. ARPDC will be seeking feedback on the proposed framework through the Provincial Advisory Committee and through Regional Advisory Committee meetings in the spring of 2023.

The seven offices are working to make resources and learning opportunities more readily available across the province. To that end the **ARPDC website** (<u>www.arpdc.ab.ca</u>) is being updated and content is more actively being added and maintained.
